Employ me!

The Youth Exchange "EMPLOY ME" will gather together 40 youngsters (18-30 years old) plus 8 group leaders coming from Hungary,Poland,Italy, Egypt, Cyprus, Morocco, Jordan,Algeria. The venue of the project will be in Cyprus, Larnaca April 2018.

After the contact making event" Kinswomen" in Poland, we realized one of the biggest problems in our countries is the high rate of youth unemployment. Especially we noticed young people lack of communication skills to get a job.

For this reason, the aim of the Youth Exchange is to enhance communication skills for better employability. Especially participants will improve their knowledge of types of communications, increase knowledge in recruitment process in different countries, improve self-confidence in the job market.

All this will be achieved through non-formal education methods such as simulations, role-plays,workshops. At the end of the project participants will gain skills that will help them to find a job in their field of interest.


We will create a video-guide which will include useful information, tips and tricks to create a CV, a resume letter, communication tools, etc..The guide will have a strong international impact as we will put it on-line and be accessible to all.

Participants once come back home will share their experience during a local event they will organize in their country.

SM(ART)

Training course called (SM)ART will take place in Kiev from 10 to 20th September and it will bring together 28 your workers, trainers, leaders from 6 different countries: Ukraine, Tunisia, Jordan, Italy, Hungary and Poland. The main aim od the project is to enhance awareness of proper social media usage in order to be able prevent youngsters from internet threatens. Lack of knowledge of internet hazards was a key factor that prompt us to create platform to embrace youth workers with information and knowledge which will enable them to inform youngsters how to use social media properly. In order to fully understand the social networks and rise the awareness of internet hazards through training the youth workers will improve the knowledge on social media usage and information security. We will use the non-formal methods such as simulation games, minigames, quize etc. to provide youth workers with the tools which they can use it later in their local communities. The result of the project will be prepared content which will be applied to learning platform called MOODLE which will allow to spread the knowledge to stakeholders interested in the topic.





RESPECT

Lack of intercultural communication among people from different regions, religions and cultures and increasing tolerance crisis was the main reason why we decided to create project Respect which will take place in Estonia from 9 - 17 May 2018 .The project will bring together youth between 18 to 30 from different regions in Europe: Estonia, Cyprus, and Ukraine as well as participants from : Algeria and Jordan. The youth exchange aims at transferring knowledge, expanding skills, shaping positive attitudes of youngsters and building mutual understanding between countries, despite their cultural differences in order to raise awareness for the protection of human rights and personal dignity. During the 8 days of youth exchange, we will use different methods of nonformal education to discuss various topics for example: breaking stereotypes by role play activities, workshops, discussions on how media influence the believes, perceptions and opinions of people, simulations and brainstorming on how to implement and promote what the participants have learnt among their community by exchanging best practices and tools. The result of the youth exchange will be video which will raise the awareness about diversity acceptance among the

participants' communities ...

Celebrate Diversity

With the raise of refugee crisis, a growth of extremism and intolerance has been observed in our societies in the last years. The training course titled Celebrate Diversity will be hosted between 1st of June until 8th of June 2018 in Bialystok, Poland. The project will bring together 30 youth workers from Algeria, Egypt, Morocco, Israel, Poland, Italy, Malta, Greece, Ukraine and Bulgaria. Our goal is to promote tolerance of different religions within the frame of Erasmus+ programme. Participants will be involved in different activities of non-formal education such as role-plays, simulations, open space discussions, brain – storming, ice – breakers and reflection groups. The procuration of such activities will be helpful for youth workers in their daily work with youth and will have add value for their local communities. As a result of this training course participants will create an E Book toolbox about tolerance of religions, which will be useful handbook for all interested in the topic.





21 days of healthy life

Youth exchange called 21 days of healthy life, gathers 30 youngsters aged 18 to 25 years old, coming from Poland, Cyprus, Greece, Tunisia, Egypt and Morocco for 9 days. The project aim is to raise awareness on healthy life style among youngsters within the frame of Erasmus plus programme.

Through the exchange of good practices on food habits, culture and style in their own countries, enhance knowledge on Healthy food, Learning Skills on cooking healthy-easy tips of cooking classes, and raise awareness on environmental issues and good tips to face them such as organic foodpermaculture-recycling and left over, as well as quality standards and food consumption. They will achieve this through the activities of non-formal learning methods such as simulation, cooking classes, role plays, debates, group reflection, World café, and energizers and games. As a result we aim to create an online educational toolkit available in different languages to learn some simple international recipes, and good habits and tips of advices for a healthy life style.

In.Clude+

Training Course "In.Clude+" gather together 24 youth workers, trainers, young activists, coming from Cyprus, Greece, Italy, Morocco, Egypt and Algeria, in Larnaca, Cyprus for 7 days. The project aim is to create a dialogue platform to facilitate integration of migrants in local communities in MEDA countries within the framework of Erasmus plus program. The project aims to encourage the active participation of young people in fighting against discrimination, marginalization and hate speech, but also in promoting equality, social solidarity and tolerance through Media visual tool and Use of Media on Human rights in the Mediterranean Region. The project answers to the needs and learning objectives of the participating youth workers and their organizations. The design of the Training course will contain working sessions being specifically designed to meet those needs, have a participatory character, active and creative, in order to stimulate the active participation of youth workers and activists young Volunteers in fighting against discrimination, marginalization and hate speech and promote equality, social solidarity and tolerance through visual arts and Media. Object: To raise awareness through applied Media for a social inclusion of Migrants and refugees in Mediterranean countries To develop the initiative and active participation of 24 young people in fighting against marginalization, discrimination and hate speech. To facilitate the exchange and intercultural cooperation among young people in order to develop a Media visual tool for promoting European principles of solidarity, tolerance, equality and non-discrimination among young people, both after the project and during the project. - propose spaces where volunteers, activists and organizations can meet and share knowledge, experiences and methods on promoting non-violent communication and intercultural dialogue, providing alternatives to violent extremism; - encourage critical thinking on issues regarding human rights refugees and migration, in order to produce alternative narratives through final visual Media toolkit in different languages of the Medditeranian Region- improve cooperation and exchange between the EU and the Southern Mediterranean region.
